






#### **CHALLENGE EXERCISES**

Click for the pitch "C"








# **SECTION 2: INTERVALS**

An <u>Interval</u>, in music, is the distance between any two notes. In this level, the intervals of a 2nd, 3rd, 4th & 5th will be covered. When counting intervals, be sure to include the bottom and top notes.

For singing, Do-Re is a 2nd, Do-Mi is a 3rd, Do-Fa is a 4th and Do-Sol is a 5th.

Intervals are sung melodically (one note following another, creating a melody), or harmonically (two notes at the same time - two singers singing at the same time).

Look at the examples below. Click "play" to hear each line of exmaples.



In singing, 2nds, 3rds, 4ths & 5ths use the following solfege. Click to hear each example.





























## INTERVAL EAR-TRAINING

## **INTERVAL OF A 5TH**

Here is a list of famous songs that contain 5ths. You can hear these songs in your head while you are sight-singing. Click to hear each example!



Now, let's sing "La." Every time you see the note A, you will sing the word "La" on its pitch. Click for the pitch "A"



Now, let's sing "Ti." Every time you see the note B, you will sing the word "Ti" on its pitch. Click for the pitch "B"



Let's put "Do," "Re," "Mi," "Fa," "Sol," "La," and "Ti" together. Try to sing these melodies on your own, then click play and sing along. All of these melodies contain the interval of a 2nd (notes moving stepwise). Notice there are sixteenth notes in these examples as well! Click for the starting pitch "C"
